MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM HELD IN THE CONFERENCE ROOM AT CITY HALL ON WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 23, 2000 AT 1:30 PM.

I. <u>ROLL CALL</u>:

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A. Employees' Retirement Board:

The Chairman called the meeting to order at 1:30 PM.

Trustees present were Mayor Thomas Ramiccio (Chairman), Finance Director Chuck Powers and Messrs. Robert Lepa, John Charest and Pat Testa. Also present were Board Attorney Robert A. Sugarman and Recording Secretary Valerie Hurley, City Clerk's Office.

II. ADDITIONS/DELETIONS/REORDERING:

A. <u>Employees' Retirement Board</u>:

- Action: It was moved by Mr. Powers, seconded by Mr. Charest, to waive the rules to add <u>New Business</u> items 3. and 4.; and to approve the agenda as set at this time.
 - <u>Vote</u>: All Aye.

IV. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>:

A. Employees' Retirement Board:

1. From Nolan Keith Nicholson, inquiring whether the Pension Plan was a Defined Benefit Retirement Plan in accordance with IRC 414(j).

The Board Attorney explained that the Retirement System was a "defined benefit retirement plan" within the meaning of Section 414(j) of the Internal Revenue Code.

<u>CONSENSUS</u> was to direct the Board Attorney to notify Mr. Nicholson that the Retirement System was a "defined benefit retirement plan" within the meaning of Section 414(j) of the Internal Revenue Code.

2. From Patricia Thorne, Esq., Langer & Thorne, dated February 7, 2000, re Charles Shelnutt being entitled to a Duty Disability Retirement.

Mr. Powers pointed out that the Pension Code stated that, when employees on disability retirement reached normal retirement age, they would be reclassified to regular retirement. Since Mr. Shelnutt retired April 1, 1999 under regular retirement (Rule of 75), Mr. Powers believed he was not eligible for a disability retirement.

<u>CONSENSUS</u> was to direct the Board Attorney to notify Patricia Thorne that Mr. Shelnutt had retired under regular retirement and, therefore, was not eligible for disability retirement.

3. (Added) From Roosevelt McCray, Utilities Department, requesting regular retirement based on the Rule of 75, effective March 3, 2000.

<u>Action</u>: It was moved by Mr. Powers, seconded by Mr. Testa, to grant with regret the request of Roosevelt McCray, Utilities Department, for regular retirement based on the Rule of 75, effective March 3, 2000.

Vote: All Aye.

4. (Added) Administer Oath of Office to appointed representative.

The Secretary administered the oath to Mr. Robert Lepa, who was appointed by the City Commission to complete an unexpired term ending August 1, 2000.

B. <u>Pertained to Police Retirement Board</u>:

C. Employees' and Police Retirement Boards:

1. Discuss lump sum payment of DROP contributions within 30 days.

Mr. Powers expressed concern that the interest calculations from Merrill Lynch following the end of a quarter were not being received in time to determine the lump sum payment of DROP contributions. Mr. Lepa stated that the interest calculations should be available within 12 days of the end of the quarter.

<u>CONSENSUS</u> was to postpone discussion until the March 29, 2000 meeting in order to question Mr. Michael Callaway, Merrill Lynch Consulting Services, regarding the time period to calculate the return at the end of a quarter.

2. Discuss DROP entrance date.

The DROP Rules stated that "a participant of the System may enter into the DROP on the first day of any month following the attainment of normal retirement age." It was noted that, since the pension benefits were pro-rated, this change would not cause any problems.

<u>Action</u>: It was moved by Mr. Powers, seconded by Mr. Testa, to direct the Board Attorney to amend the wording in the DROP Rules to allow an employee to enter the DROP Plan at any time.

Vote: All Aye.

Board Attorney Robert Sugarman reported on new legislation that was being pushed by the Division of Retirement's Chief Actuary, Charles Slavin, providing a limit of 20% on foreign investments for the Employees' Retirement System (Police Retirement System limit was currently 10%) and requiring mandatory continuing education for trustees. He encouraged all trustees to attend the 21st Annual Police Officers' and Firefighters' Trustees School in Tallahassee to be held March 20-22, 2000.
